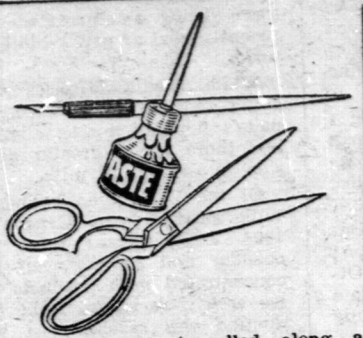
ESSEX, JORDAN, DURANT... more than 2,400 different cars have been made in North America. Of these, less than thirty still make new appearances each year on Canadian roads.

REGULAR MEETING JARVIS VILLAGE COUNCIL

Jarvis, December 1st, 1959

All the members present with Reeve David McBride in the chair. Craddock and Held - That the minutes of the last regular meeting of November 3rd be adopted as read. Craddock and Held - That the building permits of The Canadian Bank of Commerce to build a house on the new Street north of Peel Street on the Warren Keen property be approved, also Bank on Talbot Street east of No. 6 Highway, lot 3 plan No. 343 in the Village of Jarvis be approved.

Field and Smelser - That Louis Bill be granted \$15.00 towards the cost of culvert in front of his house on Talbot Street.

Smelser and Field - That \$1,500.00 be transferred to the Jarvis and Walpole Municipal Building account. Smelser and Craddock - That accounts No. 199 to 214 as read be paid.

A delegation from the Jarvis Public School Board met with the Council to discuss ways and means of protecting the school children when crossing No. 6 Highway on their way to and from school.

Craddock and Held - That the next Council meeting be held at 8.15 P.M. on December 14th, 1959.

Council adjourned briefly to allow the Hydro Committee to meet. A letter was read from the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario stating that the wholesale cost of Hydro power for 1960 will be somewhat higher. The interim rate for the Jarvis utility which will become effective on January 1st, 1960 is \$47.10 per kilowatt/annum.

Held and Field - That Hydro accounts Nos. 758 to 765 be accepted and paid.

Craddock and Held - That we do now adjourn to meet again on December 14th or at the call of the Reeve.

All motions were carried. The Building permits were approved. Regular Meeting December 14th.

All members present with the Reeve David McBride in the chair. Smelser and Field - That the minutes of the last regular meeting on December 1st be adopted as read. Craddock and Held - That the British American Assurance Co. policy No. A-31497 be accepted.

Field and Held - That the estimated expenditure for the year 1960 be Roads \$2,500.00; Bridges \$500.00; Maintenance \$2,000.00. These are estimates only and are subject to Ontario Department of Highways.

Craddock and Smelser - That Bert Pallas be allowed \$18.00 for a culvert in front of his residence on No. 3 Highway.

Smelser and Held - That \$1,447.18 be transferred from the savings account to the current account, this money is for the construction and maintenance of sidewalks in the Village of Jarvis for the year 1959.

Held and Craddock - That accounts No. 213 to 236 be accepted and paid.

All the motions carried. Smelser and Craddock - That we do now adjourn. Reeve. DAVID McBRIDE, Reeve. HOWARD KROUSE, Clerk.
