IMMUNIZATION CLINICS FOR ADULTS AND PRE SCHOOL CHILDREN IN JARVIS AND WALPOLE TOWNSHIP

Clinics will be held on the following dates and at the Centres and Times specified:

(1) At Jarvis Community Hall - January 10th, February 12th, and March 11th, 1960 from 1.30 P.M. to 2.30 P.M.

(2) At Springvale Community Hall on January 11th, February 15th and March 14th, 1960 from 11.00 A.M. to 12.00 noon.

(3) At Nanticoke Hall - January 22nd, February 15th and March 18th, 1960 from 1.00 P.M. to 2.00 P.M.

(4) At Selkirk I.O.O.F. Hall - January 23rd, February 28th and March 29th, 1960 from 1.00 P.M. to 2.00 P.M.

Pre School Children 6 months of age and over may attend ANY of the clinics and receive their First, Second and THIRD doses of Quadruple Vaccine (combined Diphtheria, Whooping Cough, Tetanus and Polio) and their FOURTH dose in 1961. Re-inforcing doses also will be given at any of the CLINICS to pre school children requiring the same. ADULTS desiring Polio-vaccination may receive their first and second doses at the first two clinics at any of the above places, with the Third dose in 1961.

At the March Clinics the Third dose of Polio Vaccine will be given to those who received their first and second doses in 1959.

At the March Clinics also the Fourth dose of Quadruple Vaccine will be given to those who received their three doses in 1959 (May, June and September).
