A new variety of spring barley, called York, appears on the recommended list for the first time this year. This variety was distributed to elite seed growers last year and several thousand bushels are available for seeding in 1959. York is a high-yielding feed barley, somewhat similar to Brant, but much stronger strawed and with much better thresh ability.
