Kenneth Parkinson was re-elected Reeve of the Township of Walpole in a close election race on Monday with a light vote recorded in the eight polling sub-divisions. He had a forty-four vote margin over his opponent at Charles Sheppard. Last year, ex-Councillor Edward Montague came back to win the election for the same office this year. Last year he was defeated by Charles Sheppard the closest election contests for a long time.

Form County Association for Retarded Children

The Haldimand Association for Retarded Children was formed at a meeting in the Fisherville Community Centre on Monday night. The decision to form such an Association is the result of steps taken more than a year ago by the Fisherville Lions Club to meet a growing need in the Township. It now will be a matter of time before the newly formed Association for Retarded Children will be established in the County. Mr. George for the newly formed Association to acquire the property, secure instruction personnel and provide means of transportation for pupils from all sections of the County.

A full slate of officers with representatives from all parts of the County was named and will proceed to act on the ground work already established by the Fisherville group. The original purpose of the group was to establish a school for retarded children. Investigations pointed up many complications to the undertaking and the necessity of forming an Association to work under the Ontario Association for Retarded Children.
