This Week - -

The strike at the crown-owned Polymer Corporation at Sarnia was settled Monday, after lasting 96 days, in a marathon series of talks that began at 2 P.M. on Sunday.

Details of the settlement were held until they had been voted on by the membership of the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union (O.C.A.W.). Originally there were 56 members in the union. The strike was called by the O.C.A.W. on Sunday.

A broken timber pile at the base of a lock gate in the Welland Canal had all transit between Lake Ontario and Lake Erie last week end. Canal officials at first estimated that the pile would take three to four days, but it was done in about 30 hours.

On Monday morning, while repairs were made, some 65 ships were riding at anchor at the entrance to the canal. Forty-three were at Lake Ontario entrance at Thorold, and 22 at the Lake Erie entrance at Port Weller. The hold-up involved almost as many ships as were tied up when the first heavy influx of foreign vessels reached the canal after the St. Lawrence Seaway was opened.

The gate damage at Lock 4, just east of Thorold, was believed caused by a heavy rope fender which may have fallen into the lock from a foreign vessel, breaking the 18-inch square timber sill when the gate was closed.

A mile-long section of the canal was drained to permit repairs and was hampered by heavy seas from other locks. One difficulty was that special gates in Lock 4 which would permit the unbound channel lock to be refilled and partially restore traffic were clogged with rubble and cement. They had not been used for about 25 years.
