Brief Notes for the Busy Farmer

Inspected plants and of this number

1959 were of the "A" grade. The

number of "C" hogs was the

lowest in the history of the time

and the sale of sows also registered quite

an increase.

Speaking of hog grades, it has re-

cently been announced that some

changes are under consideration and

it is expected that the new grades will be

announced later this year. It is

also proposed to discontinue the pre-

mium of the "B" grade and increase

the premium to \$3.00 on the "A"

grade. Some slight change is being

made in the weight ranges for some

of the upper grades and it would ap-

pear that the lighter hog is being re-

placed by grades A, B, C, and D.

A total of 900,000 head of cattle

have been treated under the Brucel-

laus Control Area Plan in Ontario

since the end of June. Six coun-

ties have now been certified. Twen-

ty-one counties are now in the pro-

cess of being tested and the average

percentage of reactors stands at 87

per cent. Brant County which is

now almost completed has 82 per

cent of the reactors. Likewise Ven-

ue County has less than one per cent

reactors. Lincoln County which is

just starting and is now in the

process of being tested has 27.78

per cent reactors. This represents

the lowest percentage in the pro-

cess of being tested in the provin-
