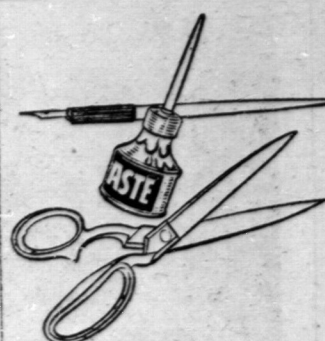

Now that the election is underway and by the time this is read it will be over in most cases, we feel free to register a complaint against the Froot Government. We can think of no good reason why the election couldn't have been held on a Wednesday instead of Thursday. If it had been held on Wednesday it would have fitted into our deadline perfectly and we could have published the results as quickly as any other newspaper in the country. As it is we'll have to be six days late. After all the nice things we've said about the Froot Government we think the least they could have done would have been to call the election one day earlier. 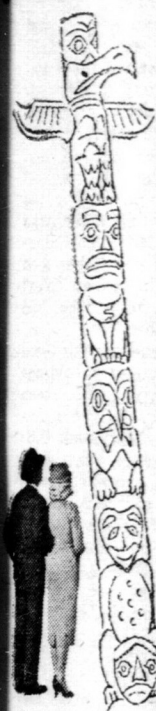
