## Retarded Children School Will Open This Fall

The executive for the Haldimand Association for retarded children announced this week that a school for the instruction of retarded children in the Haldimand County will open at Canfield in September. A number of registrations are already in the hands of the education committee and it is anticipated more will be forthcoming.

The Association is currently concerned with the financing of the project. While pledges already made to the school are appreciated, the decision to announce an opening date, it will still be necessary to raise several thousand dollars in order to ensure that the project is soundly established. After the first year of operation it should be a fairly easy task for the association to finance the project.

Organizations that have already indicated their support include the Fisherville Lions Club with a pledge of \$1,000. The Cayuga Kinsmen Club has announced that they will purchase a bus (at an estimated cost of \$3,000) to transport the children to the school. This project will be carried out, they hope, with the cooperation of other Kinsmen Clubs in the County. Erie Ladies' Orange Lodge \$50; Ontario Provincial Police \$100; Blackheath Lions Club \$500.

Other organizations in the County will be contacted in the immediate future in the hope they too will enlist their support in this worthwhile effort. An objective of \$8,000 has been set up. Mr. Miller, of Jarvis, has been named chairman of a committee to arrange the financing. Contributions from any organization in the County of Haldimand will be gratefully accepted in this move to meet a very definite need within the County.
