J. S. Mitchell President of Mutual Fire Underwriters

J. S. Mitchell, of Jarvis, was elected President of the Mutual Fire Underwriters of Ontario, at the Annual convention of that body in the King Edward Hotel, Toronto, on Thursday of last week.

Mr. Mitchell is the secretary-treasurer of the Walpole Mutual Fire Insurance Co., Jarvis, and is the representative of that organization to the Ontario body. The late George L. Miller, a former secretary-treasurer of the Walpole Mutual was President in 1925. Five years later Mr. J. J. Parsons was elected to the Presidency. Mr. Parsons is the oldest living past President of the Mutual Fire Underwriters of Ontario.

Mr. Mitchell was appointed Secretary-Treasurer of the Walpole Mutual Fire Insurance Co. in 1949. He was first elected to the Provincial executive in 1955. His active participation in the affairs of the Provincial body and his contribution to the problems of Mutual Fire underwriting took him to the Presidency of Ontario body in a relatively short time.

Several representatives from the local Companies were in attendance at the Convention in Toronto last week. Dr. Bruce A. Smith, of Port Dover, is President of the Walpole Mutual.
