BY-LAW NO. 1549

A BY-LAW TO REGULATE THE LOCATION OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES ON LAND ADJA-

NOW, THEREFORE, the COUN-CIL of the CORPORATION of the COUNTY of HALDIMAND ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. This By-Law shall apply to all

lands lying within a distance of 150 feet from the limits of all County Roads in the County of Haldimand, except

(a) County Road No. 22 in the Township of Moulton (b) that portion of County Road No. 11 in the Township of Dunn, which extends southerly from the southerly limit of the Road between Concessions three and four, adjacent to the Westerly bank of the Grand River in the Naval Reserve.

(c) that portion of County Road No. 11 in the Township of Dunn, which extends northerly from the northerly limit of the Road between Concessions Three and Four along and adjacent to the westerly bank of the Grand River.

2. No person shall erect any build-(a) County Road No. 22 in the Township of Moulton
(b) that portion of County Road

2. No person shall erect any building or structure within 150 feet of any County Road to which this by law applies, without first obtaining a permit from the County Engineer.

3. No person shall erect any building or structure, any part of which is located closer to the nearest limit.
