system. All telephone sets now in use will have to be changed for dial operation.

"Before the installation begins the equipment must be engineered and tailored to meet the specific needs of Jarvis," Mr. McArthur said.

The whole program must be carefully co-ordinated so that all Jarvis telephones can be switched over to dial operation at the same time and with no interruption of service.

Mr. McArthur said that Bell exchanges are classified into 11 rate groups based on the number of telephones in the local calling area of each exchange. With the inclusion of Hagersville in Jarvis' toll-free local calling area, Jarvis will move into a new rate group and the rates for this group will apply.
