



We're discovering that however beneficial Hospital Insurance may be to the Ontarians who are subscribers to the plan, there is no guarantee a Hospital bed will be available if you need one. No guarantee, that is, unless we as individuals recognize that we must supply the beds. It can be argued that if insurance is sold to provide a service then the facilities for that service should be available at all times.

Be that as it may, the construction of Hospital facilities still remains the responsibility of the community and evidence will accrue to anyone who wants to look into the matter that this community does not have the facilities which will guarantee a workable Hospital Plan.

Prior to January 1st, 1959, the operations of Hospital facilities were conducted with a strict view of trying to balance the budgets and in many cases quite unsuccessfully. Since January 1st, 1959, there is no problem in balancing budgets because the costs are taken care of by the Hospital Plan. It does bring into focus however, the fact that the Hospitals already established were built by the people of the community in which they are located. Therefore, who should have first call on the beds in case of illness? The answer to that question is self evident. Prior to January 1st, 1959, any of us could have been taken care of by the Hospital Plan.

We've also discovered, in recent weeks, that providing Hospital accommodation is a little different than putting on the storm windows in preparation for the cold weather. Building a Hospital, the size we are told a Hospital should be in West Haldimand, presents some mighty interesting complications. Not the least of these is the problem of finding the necessary money to do the job. It will take a lot of arguing, pleading and probably begging to overcome this one obstacle and it seems too bad that is the case.

In order to overcome this problem one thing must first be established. The people of West Haldimand must become personally aware of the need of a Hospital; (2) The people of West Haldimand must accept the fact that their personal resources will be required to do the job and they must be willing to shoulder their fair share; (3) We must also take a personal interest in the establishment.

We're not fooling ourself one bit when we say we've a long way to go. We do hope, however, that the people of West Haldimand can be of one mind with respect to this project which will be designed to service the human body and to attach the importance to it which it deserves. We hope we can all recognize it and fulfill a need which is vital to the community.
