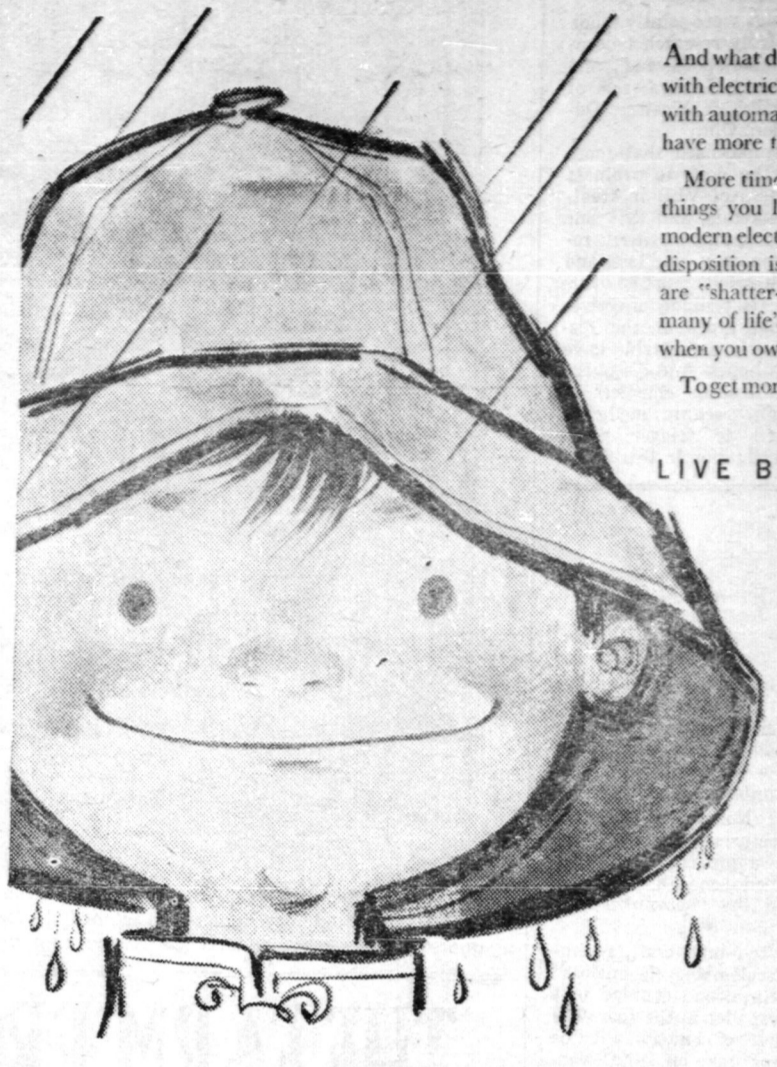
Now most losers do not generally cause us to feel this way but our numerous experiences with Doc at the bowling alley, playing hoos and other such rugged sports have generated
