ON THE FARM FRONT (continued from page one) 91 per cent of the eggs that were produced. Some 20 or 30 years ago, the consumption level just about kept even with production.

There were 35 bears approved under the Bear Premium Policy during the month of June. These were submitted by 10 breeders across the province, and with the exception of Mr. Joseph Bernard at Waterford, none of them were very close to Haldimand County. Most of them were plenty of qualified bears available and no breeder should continue to use a poor bear particularly when a generous premium is being provided by the Ontario Department of Agriculture.

Do you know that 27 farm people drowned last year. If you have a farm pond, be sure to keep a 10 or 12 foot bamboo pole, or an inner tube on a rope or a 2" x 8" x 6" cedar plank on a rope handy, advises Hal Wright, the Department of Agriculture Safety Specialist. The plank is a most useful article for this purpose as it can be more easily directed towards the victim. None of these items cost very much but they might save a life.
