

Well we got safely back from our all too short trip to Lake Ontario and we hasten to report the area is just as lovely as ever, the fish just as plentiful and the natives just as accommodating. In our three day fishing expedition we travelled about 800 miles by automobile and 100 miles by boat with Doc Austin the pilot in both instances. We have always been impressed with the wonders of nature in the rough and it is there to gaze upon to the heart's content. Beaver are plentiful this year and a cruise around some of the bays just after sun down will reveal many of these industrious creatures hard at work. Beaver houses dot the shoreline from one end of the lake to the other. This is also great moose country and, although we didn't see one this trip, there are plenty of tracks.

This rugged country, coupled with a warm sun, and a placid lake makes an idyllic setting that would appeal to anyone. It also whets the appetite, a condition that is always taken care of by Bob Smith when he gets his hands on a skillet. It would be a revelation to some of our best cooks if they could see Bob at work in the kitchen of his cottage on Rabbit Island.

The immensity of the Ontario Northland is another thing that always impresses us. If all of the citizens of Southern Ontario decided

to go north at the same time we think there would be room for all in the vast expanse of country north of North Bay. It is encouraging to see the increasing number of Provincial parks that have been established for these people who are located in attractive settings and provide economical facilities for holidaymakers.

We Ontarians are indeed fortunate to live at the doorway to such a vast area of natural grandeur. It would seem too that more and more people are beginning to realize this and as the years go on and roads throughout the Northland improve, increasing numbers from the south will discover the wonders of the Northland.

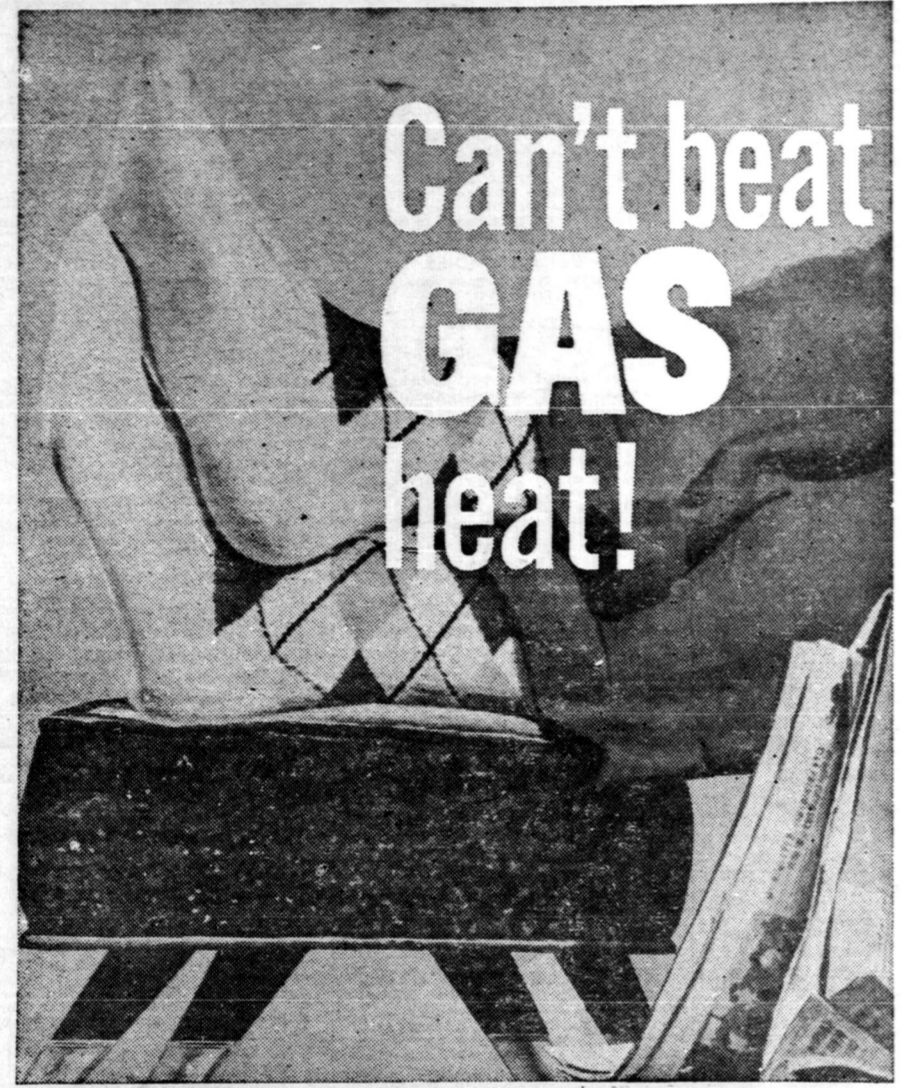
