## Greenfield, Meehan and Field Elected to Walpole Council

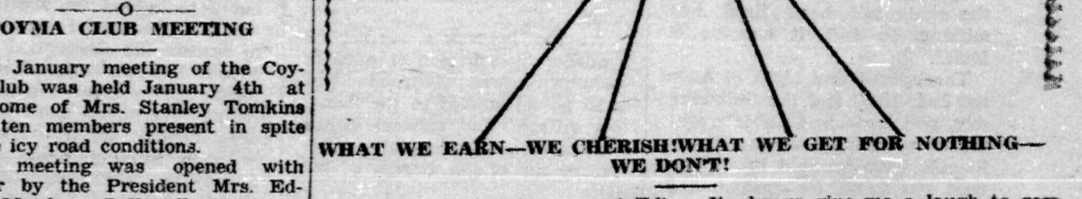
### Church Notes Phibbs, Phillips and Rutherford Get Seats on North Area School Board

Key roads and an acclamation for the Reeveship and Deputy-Reeveship in Walpole, probably helped to account for the comparatively light vote in the Township Council election race on Monday.  
Hugh Greenfield, the only 1959 Council member seeking re-election topped the poll by a substantial majority. Of the five new-comers Bruce Meehan led the race and was followed by Blake Field to complete the new Council for 1960. The latter had a close contest with Harold Evans who, in the unofficial count, trailed by a mere three votes. Russell Hare and Douglas Martin followed the voting in that order.
