CONTRACT AWARDED FOR FEDERAL BUILDING AT CALEDONIA

A \$40,429 contract has been awarded by the Department of Public Works to Lester Shoals Limited of Wainfleet, Ontario, for the construction of a Federal Building at Caledonia, Ontario, to provide accommodation for the Post Office. This was announced today by Mr. John A. Charlton, M.P. for Brant-Haldimand, on behalf of the Honourable David J. Walker, Minister of Public Works.

The firm submitted the lowest bid of five in response to advertising for Public Tenders. The work is scheduled for completion in six months. The new one storey building is to be erected near the south-west corner of Calhoun and Argyle Streets and will be approximately 50 feet by 50 feet. It will be constructed of reinforced concrete and wood beams.

The exterior will be finished in brick veneer and the interior will be of plaster and plywood with linoleum on the floors. Fluorescent lighting will be installed and heating will be by a coal, stoker fired hot water system. Plans and specifications were prepared by the Toronto District Architect of the Department of Public Works. Supervision of the work will be under Mr. J. E. Kelly, District Architect of Toronto.

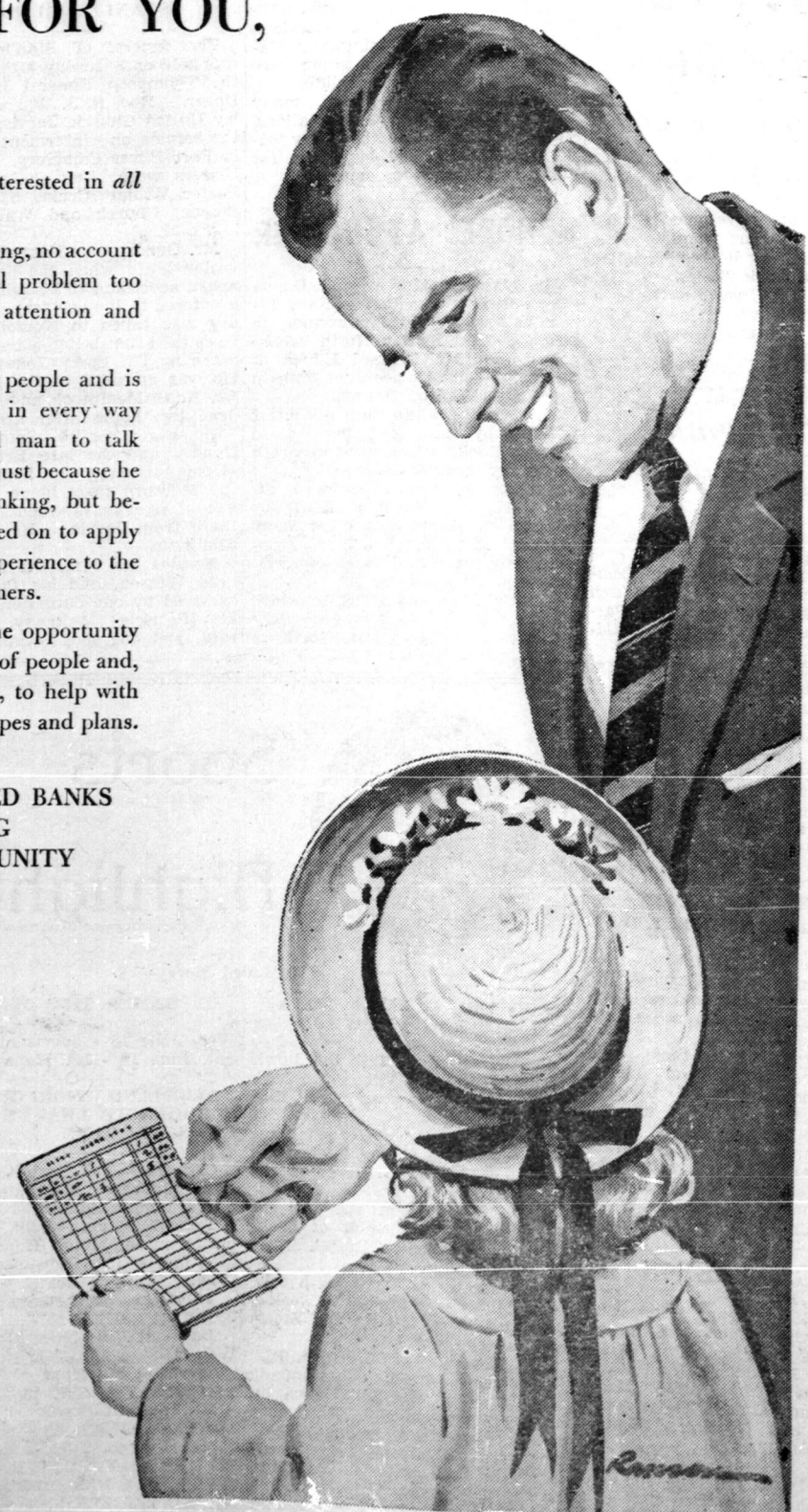

HALDIMAND COUNTY LIBERAL COMMITTEE MEETING HELD

A capacity attendance was recorded at a meeting of the Haldimand County Liberal Committee held at County Hall Tuesday night, May 31st. Liberals from every municipality in Haldimand except Cayuga and Dunn Township were at the meeting. It was held to make plans for a Liberal County Rally and to lay the foundation for the future development of a Women's Liberal Association and a Young Liberal group.

A Rally will be held in Jarvis Community Centre in September, it was decided. At that time Liberals from Haldimand will be offered the opportunity of hearing a nationally known figure, and have the chance to elect an executive in an officially formed Haldimand County Liberal Association.

The meeting named a working action, or acting executive, under the present chairman, Ken Parkinson of Walpole, to iron out details and to make a report at a meeting in a month's time.

This provisional executive consists of Mr. Parkinson; Garfield Disher, Dunnville; Bruce Stoddard, Walpole; Elsworth MacPherson, Moulton; Frank Young, Seneca; Tom Jacobs, Dunnville; Elmer Kinnear and Joe Curtin, North Cayuga.

In addition to the fall rally the working committee was charged with plans for the next meeting at which it is hoped a speaker from the Ontario Liberal Association will address the membership: plans for a summer picnic and recommendations for a county policy of organization.

Largest delegation to the meeting was from the Walpole-Jarvis Liberal Association which sent fourteen members. Second was North Cayuga with twelve in attendance.

Each municipal delegation had an opportunity to air its views and to offer any report of its activities. The Walpole-Jarvis Association told of continuing enthusiasm in all "tricks" with them. Unfortunately these "tricks" get out of hand rather rapidly. Often children throw lighted fireworks between screen and inner doors, into mailboxes, garages, and even vacant cars. This can cause a raging blaze or explosion.

"Obviously most of these children don't realize until too late the serious consequences of their pranks," commented Mr. F. H. Ellis, General Manager of the Ontario Safety League. "If they did, probably far fewer such accidents would occur."

Advice from the local and provincial fire offices includes the following safety tips to bear in mind this coming May 24th:

1. A firecracker is an explosive. Always treat it with respect.
2. If a firecracker seems to have gone out in your hand, throw it into water immediately.
3. Never cover firecrackers with glass jars or tin cans. This can result in severe injuries.
4. Sewer gratings are no place to throw lighted fireworks—they may

ignite any gas or oil pipe, cause a very serious explosion, or finally, the best place for fireworks are at a supervised community display, or make provision in a back yard to prevent sparks or flames landing on a roof.

Fire authorities tell us that the most frequent cause of mishap with fireworks is the somewhat impish urge amongst youngsters to play or "trick" with them. Unfortunately these "tricks" get out of hand rather rapidly. Often children throw lighted fireworks between screen and inner doors, into mailboxes, garages, and even vacant cars. This can cause a raging blaze or explosion.

Can playing with fireworks be considered "fun" when it results in head lines like these? "FIRECRACKER JOKE KILLS TWO FRIENDS"; "YEAR-OLD MAY BE BLINDED AFTER FIRE CRACKER EXPLOSION"; "BOY HURLS FIRECRACKER INTO BABY'S STROLLER". There is no greater irony than a practical joke that results in death or injury. True, deaths and injuries due to fireworks are not many in proportion to the total accident rate in Canada. But the trouble with those that do occur is that they begin as fun, and end in disaster. Far more frequent than deaths from fireworks are the ugly, permanent injuries they cause. Because a friend played a joke on him, a child can go through life with impaired eyesight or unsightly scars.
