Speaking English is one step in the direction of being sent abroad but unless these young people are wealthy, can be sponsored by people in America, win scholarships to study abroad or are sent on business, their opportunities travelling outside Japan are practically nil. The emigration quotas for orientals to the west are small and too Japan's economic state does not encourage travel abroad.

No matter where I go in Japan Japanese people make themselves acquainted. Many of my friends are those who come to my home for an afternoon or evening to speak English, to learn about Canadians and to have their English corrected for grammar and pronunciation. Some know they shall never leave Japan so pump me for any information about the west. Others hope. The Japanese people are always very appre-

ciative of any help you can give them to learn English. Business firms, individuals and groups will be asking your assistance. Teachers are very much in demand. I know from listening to
