In the group beyond the age of three, treatment is only suggested when the child shows definite evidence of disease on x-ray examination. Since it is known that tuberculosis may develop at any time during a person's life, after infection has taken place, those with a positive tuberculin test must be x-rayed at regular intervals, but perhaps the most important point of the program me is to ferret out the case of tuber culosis that has originally caused the infection, in each instance where a child shows a positive test. Actually,

the source of infection usually lies close to the child that is infected, and those who are closely associate live within the home, but one cannot stop by examining those who are associated with the home itself, since there may be grandparents who visit and these may be the source of infection, or there may be neighbour
