**CHRISTMAS SEAL PURCHASES HELPS SCHOOL CHILDREN**

It was not so many years ago that the Tuberculin testing of cattle was inaugurated as a protection to those who were milk drinkers, and during the course of this programme there was certain opposition. The opposition in a large measure came from those who received the greatest protection, namely the farming population. Those who lived in urban centres were protected by the pasteurization of milk. The numerous people, however, who lived on farms, and the ones that were exposed to the disease caused by bovine tuberculosis, were drinking raw milk were and which mainly affected bores, joints, glands, and meninges. It is gratifying however, that since cattle have been tuberculin tested, and those which showed a positive reaction have been destroyed, tuberculosis from drinking of raw milk is no longer an entity. Bovine tuberculosis, which is known as the human type, does not in turn affect cattle.

The programme of Tuberculin testing our younger population has greater merit now than formerly, since youngsters who show a positive tuberculin test are now known to be infected by the human bacillus. In other words they have been exposed at some time in their life to a person who has tuberculosis. The number of children who react to the tuberculin test is relatively small, and children below the age of three who are found to have a positive tuberculin test, whether or not they show evidence of disease on x-ray are eligible for treatment, in the hope that this may prevent them from developing serious tuberculosis in later years. If such children show no evidence of disease change they can safely be treated at home. Those that show evidence of disease on x-ray should have a period of treatment in Sanatorium.

In the group beyond the age of three, treatment is only suggested when the child shows definite evidence of disease on x-ray examination. Since it is known that tuberculosis may develop at any time during a person's life, after infection has taken place, those with a positive tuberculin test must be x-rayed at regular intervals, but perhaps the most important point of the programme is to ferret out the case of tuberculosis that has originally caused the infection, in each instance where a child shows a positive test. Actually, the source of infection usually lies close to the child that is infected, and those who are closely associated live within the home, but one cannot stop by examining those who are associated with the home itself, since there may be grandparents who visit and these may be the source of infection, or there may be neighbours

High School children in their second and final years. It is quite true that few cases of tuberculosis will be discovered. However, in one school of the district no less than eight cases of active tuberculosis disease requiring treatment, have been discovered over a period of three years. The source of infection in this instance, was difficult to locate. She was an advanced case of tuberculous disease who had moved into the district, and after infecting certain individuals, she removed herself from this particular location to another area. It was only after a very determined, and careful piece of detective work, that her existence was located. However, this episode was a determining factor in the inauguration of our present school programme. There may be some resistance on the part of parents to having a further test which necessitates the use of a needle. However, the test is completely harmless. It is very informative, and for reaction, it is very important, and parents are urged when the test is made available within the school area to co-operate in the programme.
