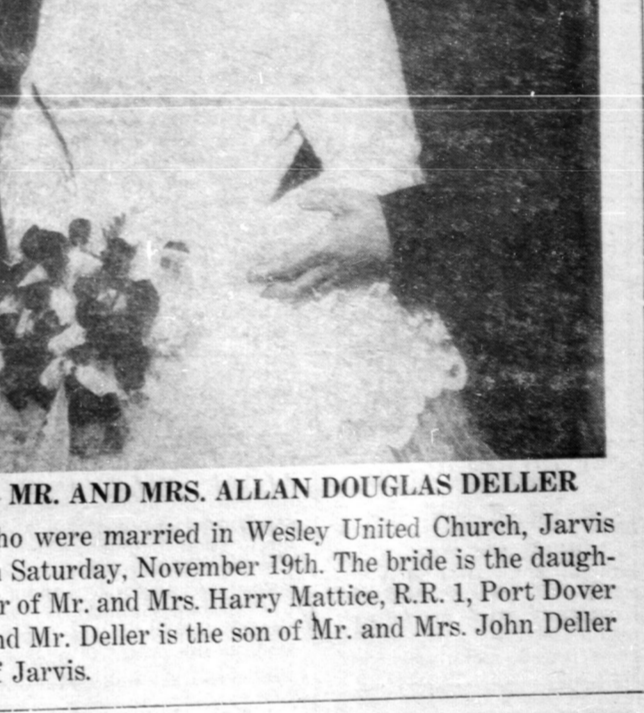

**A RECEPTION PARTY TO REMEMBER**  
 For the past few weeks the Colombo Conference Consultative Committee has been held in Tokyo. Being with the Canadian Embassy here was my good fortune to be assigned as a secretary to the Canadian delegates at the Conference.  
 One of the social highlights of the conference for me was a reception at Prime Minister Ikeeda's residence. The residence is a huge stone structure surrounded by stone walls near the city. To see it in quite a different light from what I saw during the demonstrations and riots last May. The gates are no longer barricaded and surrounded by interlocks of policemen. The entrance and interior are very elaborately decorated with fine carvings, plush red carpets and beautiful paintings. I would imagine that the reception was held in a huge drawing room which had been cleared for the numerous delegations that Prime Minister Ikeeda received that evening. Along one side of the room a very long bar had been set up displaying every kind of drink you might like and at one end and along the other wall there were sushi and yakitori bars, and tables laden with all the finest hors d'oeuvres.  
 The Prime Minister received all the guests in a receiving line and mingled among the delegates for some time. To see the various delegations was most interesting as there were twenty-one countries represented from south and south-east Asia. The costumes were most unusual and attractive.  
 Besides affording me the opportunity to visit the Prime Minister's residence, it allowed me to speak with people from such countries as Sarawak, North Borneo, Laos, Vietnam, Cambodia, India, Pakistan and many other nationalities that you would normally not be fortunate enough to meet.
