

HON. PAUL MARTIN TO ADDRESS LIBERAL RALLY



The Hon. Paul Martin, M.P. former Minister of Health and Welfare will be the speaker at the Halldam County Liberal Rally to be held in Jarvis in October.

The announcement was made at a meeting of the newly formed Halldam County Liberal Committee by Bruce Stander, chairman of the Wallace-Jarvis Liberal Association.

Both men expressed firm approval of the local Association's plans to form upon a street county basis with the objective of organizing a strong Liberal unit capable of co-operating with any adjacent area with which it might be teamed as a riding association.

The rally will be held in the Jarvis Community Center and a quota system is being established so that all municipalities may be assured of securing tickets to the event.

CBC PRODUCER TRACK VICTIM AT HAREWOOD
