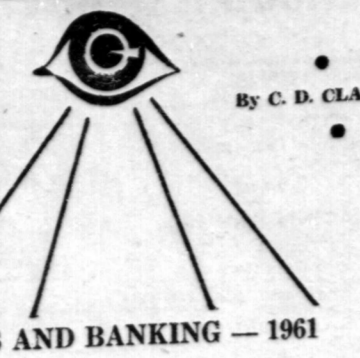

CHANGES ANNOUNCED IN CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

Hon. James N. Allan announced certain organizational changes and appointments in the Ontario Civil Service Commission at the end of 1960. Three branches are to be constituted to strengthen the Commission and to meet the increasing demands made upon this central personnel agency in the fields of recruitment, pay administration, research, training and establishment control.

Mr. J. S. Stephen has been named Director of Personnel Administration in a branch responsible for pay administration, recruitment and research associated with these matters. A supervisory position will be provided for Mr. Stephen to provide leadership in this most important and basic function to ensure an efficient recruitment of qualified staff throughout the Ontario Civil Service. In addition, a pay research officer will be developed to provide information on the salary requirements of the public sector.

Mr. Metcalfe has been in the Ontario since 1956 and has supervised in several government departments, including the Department of Lands and Forests where he was appointed to supervise personnel administration and served there since 1946. He has also served in the Ontario Civil Service Commission for two years and has broad experience in personnel administration, particularly in the field of staff development. For the past two years he has served as director of Training and Development in the Department of Transport.

Brief Notes for the Busy Farmer - By Haldimand Farmer

On the other hand if you happen to be feeding a lower quality hay or a hay mixture that is largely grasses or timothy you will need to increase the protein content of the meal mixture to about 18 per cent.

The Department of Lands and Forests has released some very interesting figures on the value of timber trees which indicate that it pays to let these trees stand a few more years before attempting to harvest the crop.

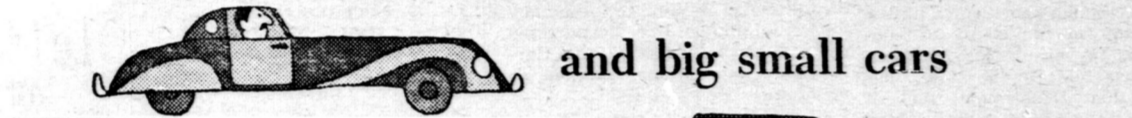

Dr. Alvin Beers of Cambridge University has stated that if you want a completely disease-free herd of pigs it is necessary that rats and birds be kept away from the pigsty.

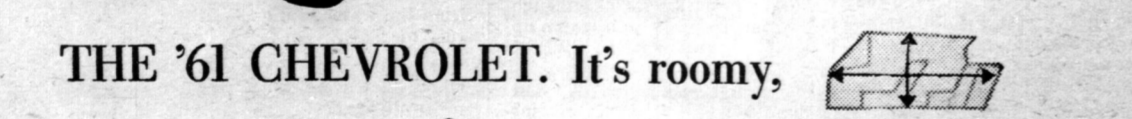
