In this way you will see the true Japan but otherwise will be living with your own people and doing the things you would do in your daily life at home. In the big cities you can see the poor and the rich but principally the rich if you go to the tourist spots. In the country you can see how the farmer lives, making an average of perhaps less than \$360.00 a year. You can experience living in a Japanese Inn, eating Japanese food and enjoying Japan-ese customs which are the greatest delight. To enjoy the real Japan you will not need large sums of money to throw around as you

can travel very cheaply by the National Railway System and enjoy the greatest service for a min-Of course it is beneficial to visit some of the larger cities and in particular Kyoto which is the art and cultural centre of Japan, but then again there are places that are not widely publicized which place you in the midst of the Jap-

anese way of life., Unfortunately, through past experience, the Japanese people feel that the tourist only wants the best with the result that he is sent to only the finest places. He will be guided and watched over like an infant but the truth is that he can get along without all this assistance. This can

In brief my advice to a tourist visiting Japan is to be prepared to enter a completely different environment to leave all thoughts of your own country behind, be prepared to adopt to the customs of the country and to be willing to learn and to accept a visit to Japan as a truly rewarding adventure among a delightful race of peoen't he classed as an tigly Canadian.
