MORE ABOUT TAXES!

We wonder how many of our readers remember the Jarvis Amateur Athletic Association? To tell the truth we had almost forgotten about it. The document which has just come to hand is a receipt from O. B. Hill to the late E. B. Hoover for the vouchers, records and assets of the Association as of Jan. 20, 1942. O. B. Hill had been elected Secretary Treasurer that year to succeed Mr. Hoover. In addition to a balance of \$273.46 in cash in the bank the Association held \$1,000 in War Loan Bonds. This amount had been accumulated over a period of about four years through the sponsorship of various functions. It was the objective of the Association to accumulate sufficient funds to install floodlights in the park. As we recall it took about three more years before this was actually accomplished.

A visit to the park last Thursday night to see the future Mickey Mantles in action was sufficient to prove the efforts made two decades ago were worth every last ounce of sweat and tears that went into the job of raising the necessary funds to install floodlights. A group of interested adults have organized all the kids in the community in a softball league that merits packed bleachers at the park every Thursday evening. The kids are having a great time; their instructors are enjoying it too, and besides, they are learning to play the game according to the rules. It would be a good thing if more local people turned out to see these games and to see for themselves
