

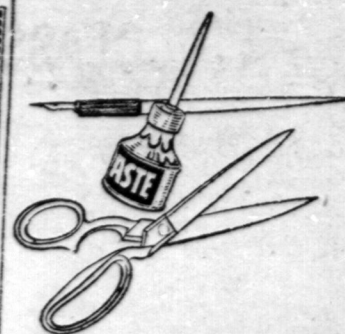

Since the Jarvis Cheviots dropped their first game against Brooklyn after going into the second overtime on Monday night, and since we didn't see the game, it might be just as well to reserve comment on the local hockey scene this week. On the other hand the Red headed favorite of all local hockey fans - namely "Red" Leonard Kelly - is very much in the news by virtue of his injury in the game against New York on Saturday night.

The latest news on "Red" is encouraging. It is expected he will be dressed for this week-end after suffering a pulled groin in the game last Saturday night. No better authority than the Toronto Maple Leaf's Coach, Manager Punch Imlach says "Red" is the teams key player and that is a statement local hockey fans will go along with. It was also interesting to note that some other than Rocket Richard in an interview with Jim Coleman the other night, stated that "Red" was the sole reason for the improvement in the Toronto team this season. He also selected "Red" along with Jack Stewart (retired) as the games two greatest defences of all time.

But "Red" is not playing defence since his trade to Toronto from Detroit. He is now playing center on the great line of Kelly, Mahovich and Nevin - the highest scoring line in the NHL. Mahovich is the league's highest goal-getter and he is approaching the record of fifty goals in one season set by Rocket Richard. He already has more than double his output of last season and it is interesting to note that "Red" Kelly has thirty-eight assists on Mahovich's goals. There is some evidence to indicate that the big M might not be near scoring record without the play-making of the Red head.

It is also interesting to note the words of Bert Olmstead, Maple Leaf winger and former member of the Montreal Canadiens team. Bert says

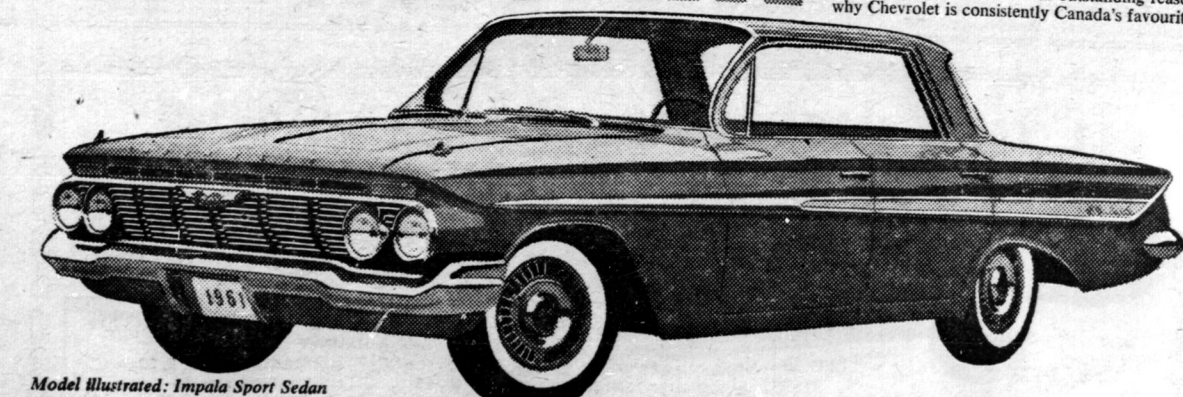

How much will the Leafs miss Kelly if his injury should keep him out of action? Well, according to Fred Cederberg, Toronto Tely sports-writer, it could mean the championship of the NHL and \$1,000 per man for the Toronto Maple Leafs if Kelly is not back in harness for the run to the wire.

About thirteen years ago we went to the Maple Leaf Gardens with "Red" Grandfather, the late Joseph Owens to see "Red" play his first

game in Toronto as a member of the Detroit Red Wings Club. It was a great exhibition that we heartily agreed with Joe, who commented after the game that his Grandson would be the greatest Professional Player of all time. After 3 seasons there is small doubt that Joe Owen's prediction has come true. We just wish he might have seen his Grandson in action in the 1960-61 season as the key player of the Toronto Maple Leaf organization.
