Reporting from the Far East

KAPPA

LIKE ALL PEOPLE, the Japanese have superstitions. One of the most interesting is the imaginary animal called the "kappa". City dwellers don't believe in it as much as the older people of the rural regions. However the belief of the kappa is planted in the minds of children at an early age with the result that the kappa has taken on a definite grotesque form.

The superstition connected with the kappa is that the drowning of a child in a lake or river is the fault of the kappa which has dragged the child to the bottom and killed him. Little children are warned by their parents to look out for kappa whenever they go to have a swim in lakes or rivers in summer.

The common description of the kappa is an amphibious animal, preferring muddy lakes and rivers. In shape it resembles a boy of about three or four years of age. The face is painted and a dark bluish colour. It has thick hair, but

on top of the head there is a dish-like depression which has no hair. This dish is very important as it holds water when the kappa goes out of the water. If the water in the shallow dish of its head dries up the kappa will die. Its back is a shell and its hands and feet webbed with sharp pointed nails.

It lives in muddy lakes and rivers, never being found in clear or rapidly flowing streams. It has a particular fondness for children but even adults often become victims of kappa.

When it sees a child in the water nearby, it will rush to him, grip him firmly with its claws and kill him finally.

This superstition must keep many a child from learning to swim. It is an interesting belief often on the ornament shops you see carved wooden figures representing the kappa. As ugly as it appears the kappa does have a personality all its own and you would surely be attracted to its funny little face and dish-like head.
