**THE FARM FRONT**  
Brief Notes for the Busy Farmer  
By Haldimand Harry

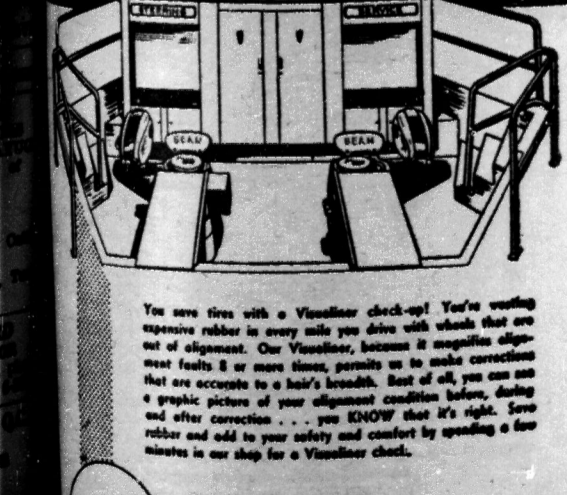
In reporting to the annual meeting of the Ontario Hog Producers a few weeks ago, Mr. J. R. Kohler, the General Manager, stated that 842 hogs had been marketed through the Cuyuga Assembly yard during a four week period ending August 25. This averages out at slightly over 200 hogs per week. The important point made by Mr. Kohler was that 38.94 per cent of the hogs were in the top grade, 46.06 per cent in the "B" grade and 8.67 per cent were "C". This is not a very high percentage of "A's" as 22 of the 45 assembly yards had a higher percentage of top grade hogs and one yard had exactly the same grade. Fourteen of the yards had over 40 per cent "A's" with 42.28 per cent being the highest.
