## 103RD ANNIVERSARY AT UNITED CHURCH NEXT SUNDAY

The congregation and friends of the United Church will be celebrating the 103rd Anniversary of the Church on Sunday next.

The morning service will be conducted by the Minister, Rev. Ronald J. Warren.

The guest preacher at the evening service will be Rev. T. R. Davies, M.C.M.A.B.D.D. of Westdale United Church in Hamilton.

Dr. Davies was born in St. Theresa, Quebec and received his early education at school in Montreal. He graduated from McGill University in 1916 with his B.A. degree and received his M.A. from the same University in 1927.

Three years later he graduated from the Union Theological College with a B.D. and from there pursued post-graduate studies at the University of Chicago.

Dr. Davies was ordained to the Ministry by the Montreal and Ottawa Conferences of the United Church of Canada in 1930 and served the Church in Alberta and Saskatchewan. In 1933 St. Andrew's College, University of Saskatchewan, conferred the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Divinity in recognition of his outstanding service to the Church in Western Canada.

During the Second World War, Dr. Davies served overseas as Chaplain of the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders. Severely wounded at Falaise in Normandy, he was awarded the Military Cross for devotion to duty and gallantry under demoralising conditions.

## VILLA NOVA CO-OPS WIN PROVINCIAL TITLE BY DEFEATING ELLIOT LAKE IN CLOSE GAMES

The first game on Saturday afternoon by the score of five to three, the Co-op battled back and forth night and morning to score a two victories respectively to being the title to Waterloo.

On Saturday afternoon it was a three run home run by winning pitcher Jerry Gellins in the fourth inning which provided the winners with their margin of victory. Gellins also had two singles for three of their nine hits off Larry Myska, the left hander of the Northern favourites.

In the second game Martin Myska pitched a sensational two hit ball game, both those being wild hits, to collect the shutout for the Co-ops and the series. Harry Reekie led the winners at the plate with three big hits and the first three runs to steal the show along with Martin Myska the winning pitcher. Myska pitched only one ball to be hit into the outfield, that being a line drive right

to left fielder Walt Pond. The third game was decided in the eighth inning on a pair of very costly errors, one to the pitcher and one to the first baseman. Reekie was safe on an error to the first baseman. He then stole second and scored when Pete Barber drilled one back at the pitcher who let the ball carom off his glove into short right field. Barber then scored the insurance run when he came the rest of the way around on a double by Walt Pond.

The game almost went the Elliot Lake way in the eighth inning when the first batter led off with a bunt single. However the second batter labelled a line drive through the middle but a sensational catch by Harry Reekie and then the throw back to first doubled them up and it looked as though the threat was put down. How to Bowl Five Pins:

HOW TO KEEP SCORE

It's astonishing how many people do bowling fairly regularly but still don't know how to keep score. Even a bowler ought to know how to keep score. If you don't know how, you can't play properly.

There used to be a confusing variety of scoring methods, used in different parts of the country. The "National Count" is the officially accepted everywhere in Canada.

The diagram shows the scoring value of the pins:

1 2 3 4 5  
Behind every two lanes, you'll find a score stand and pad of score sheets supplied by the bowling centre. Though a completed score sheet may look complicated at first, scoring is actually quite simple.

A bowling game consists of 10 frames, represented by one line on the score sheet. In each frame, you are allowed three balls, unless you manage to knock down all the pins with fewer.

In the last frame you must always roll three balls. If you knock down all the pins in the first two frames, you are allowed a bonus of two balls with the next two balls you bowl when your turn comes again.

You mark an "X" in the small square at the top of the frame. If you knock down all the pins with your first ball, this is a "strike". You don't bowl the remaining two balls in this frame. For the frame, you score 10 points, plus a bonus of the pins you knock down with the next two balls you bowl when your turn comes again.
