TEACHER CLAIMS IMPROVEMENT IN TEACHING SKILLS

Public School Principal, James Wier, came to the defence of present day teaching methods when he addressed the Lions Club on Monday night. The speaker said he couldn't agree with those who would revert to methods employed a generation ago in imparting knowledge to the students. To illustrate his point he enlarged on the subject of reading and made comparisons between present methods and those of earlier periods.

Basically the improvement, in Mr. Wier's opinion, lies in the fact the primary student is subjected to more reading experience under present day methods. A generation ago a student in the primary grade had one reader which he could conceivably memorize. Today, in the same grade, near a dozen books are employed. The earlier method gave the student a name within their grasp.

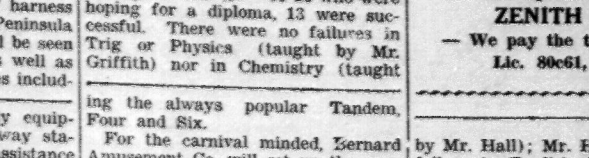

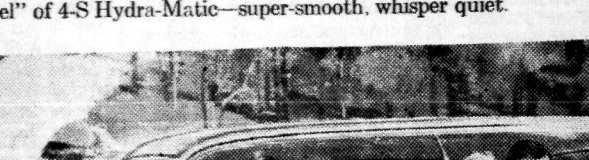
