**"A SAVIOUR WHO HAS COME"**

With the approach of another Christmas Season and New Year, the members of Community Baptist Church extend to all the readers of the Jarvis Record our sincerest greetings and good wishes.

The Christmas season seems to rush upon us. There are so many things to do—gifts to be purchased, cards to be sent, and preparations to be made for the various family gatherings. With all this activity, do we ever stop to consider the One who has come, and whose coming we seek to remember? Or have we forgotten all about Christ? As Jane Scott so aptly put it in a Christmas editorial in a Toronto newspaper some years ago, the world is just window-shopping at the manger.

Never was the attitude of the world at Christmas-time more aptly described. Window-shoppers admittedly "just look". They do not intend to buy. Their attitude may be either wistful or disinterested; but, in any event, they are "just looking". What is your attitude to the Person of the Lord Jesus Christ? Here is a promise with a personal application that meets a universal need. The angel of the Lord told these humble guardians of the flock that One had been born who could meet their personal needs. But, it was not only to the shepherds, because, as verse 10 states—"I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people." Christ did not come to be isolated or apart from us, but as Immanuel—"God with us." The question that must be asked is: Is Christ personally yours?

2. He is a Present Saviour — "This Day"

These Jewish shepherds were probably acquainted with the Old Testament Scriptures that foretold the coming of a Messiah to the world (Continued on page sixteen)
