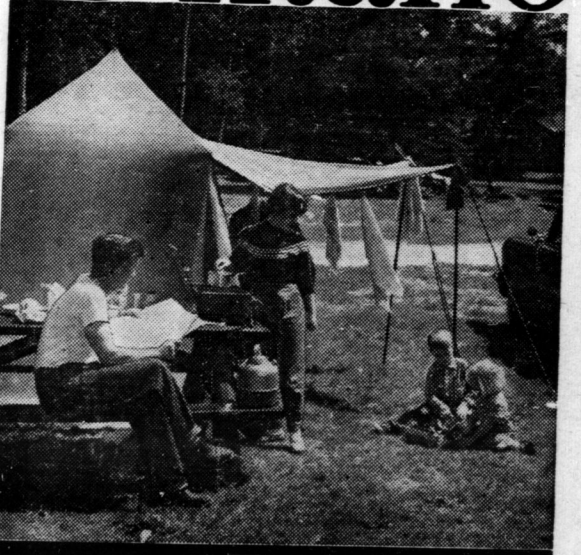

Ontario egg producers are deeply concerned over reports that shipments of eggs from Poland are being received in Canada again this spring. Tom Robson of Leamington, President of the Ontario Egg Producers Association stated in Toronto last week that this move by certain commercial firms represented a threat to the price structure for domestic production.

Reliable reports reaching producers officials indicated the latest shipments would amount to 10,000 cases or more, and that these eggs were being marketed in the breaking trade for the manufacture of egg melange, which is widely used in the baking industry. A similar situation existed last year when Polish eggs were brought into Canada, and sold in competition with Canadian eggs.

Mr. Robson dismissed the trade suggestion that there was a shortage of Canadian eggs for the breaking trade with the remark that "given some degree of reassurance that their production would not be misused, Canadian producers could eas-

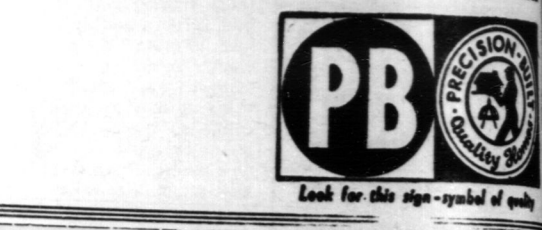

ily supply enough eggs for domestic needs and have plenty for export as well". He also pointed out that latest reports from the Canada Department of Agriculture showed the production of Frozen eggs in Canada until April 7, 1962 to be 6,997,454 lbs, nearly twice the figure for the previous year when the output was 3,538,264 lbs. to that date.

"Ontario Egg Producers are hard enough pressed by other factors" said Mr. Robson, "without having to contend with the threat of cheap imports of Polish eggs. In 1961 according to the Census there were some 75,000 egg producers in Ontario. In 1969 there were only 37,800 producers to register for the Federal Government's deficiency payment program, and recent indications are that there would be lucky to be able to find 20,000 egg producers in Ontario".

"This is just one more good reason why Ontario egg producers should join together in the organization of one marketing plan for eggs" said Mr. Robson. "The drastic reduction in the number of producers in Ontario, and the regular recurrence of such threats to the egg price structure in Ontario points again to the need for such organized action". "Ontario producers have a reputation for a high quality product and we intend to press strongly for complete assurance that she will receive nothing but this high quality product", said the President of the Ontario Egg Producers Association.
