Ranking only seventh in size among Canada's 12 law schools, Dalhousie University's law faculty has been named one of the best in the country by the Third Annual Canadian Facts.

The first principle, good health, is a child's life at the time he is beginning to develop his day-to-day self-care habits. He is encouraged to eat regularly, to sleep regularly and so on. These habits together with his own health and physical condition.
