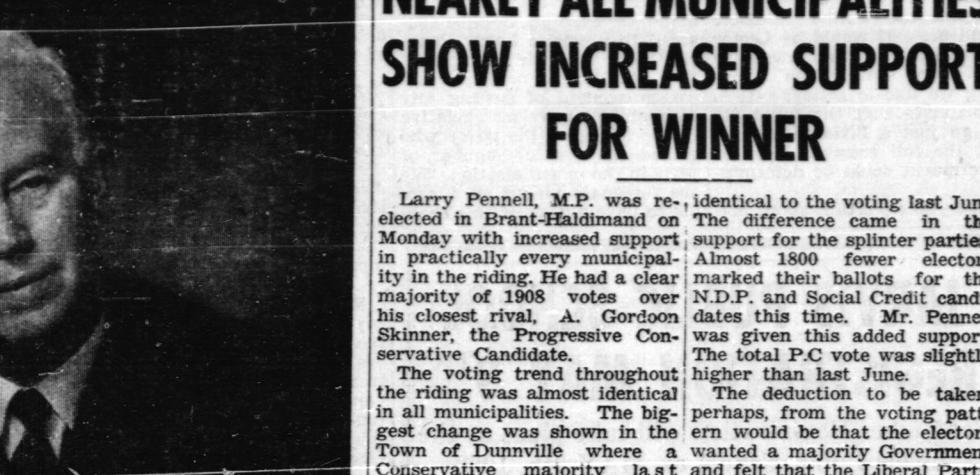
WEST HALDIMAND AUXILIARY HEAR SPEAKER

LARRY PENNELL RE-ELECTED IN BRANT-HALDIMAND WITH INCREASED MARGIN

Larry Pennell, M.P. was re-elected in Brant-Haldimand on Monday with increased support. Almost 1800 fewer electors marked their ballots for the N.D.P. and Social Credit candidates this time. Mr. Pennell was given this added support. The total P.C. vote was slightly higher than last June.

The voting trend throughout the riding was almost identical in all municipalities. The biggest change was shown in the Town of Dunville where a Conservative majority last week was changed to a Liberal majority of 239. Gordon Skinner, the P.C. Skinner toured the riding on Monday night to express their thanks to their party workers, Seena and Jarvis. Mr. Pennell addressed a group of his workers at the Jarvis Community Hall late in the evening.

Constitutionally the Prime Minister would be within his rights to go before Parliament as the Government leader, but he would be dependent for support from both Social Credit and N.D.P. forces. This would appear unwise. By the same token Mr. Pearson must find support for his party, most likely the NDP and, here again, there could be trouble with two parties entertaining opposite views on the defence issue. Notwithstanding, the outcome fact is that no party emerged with clear majority. It is doubtful if some solution will not be found to proceed with the present Government without the necessity of again going to the people for a decision.
