SIMCOE EDITOR COMMENDS JAS. N. ALLAN AT THE CHURCH

(The following editorial appeared in the August 21st edition of the Simcoe Reformer) THERE CAN BE NO DOUBT that rival political parties will have difficulty in overcoming the Progressive Conservative candidate in Haldimand-Norfolk, the Honourable James N. Allan, Provincial Treasurer of Ontario in the election September 25th.

So far as Norfolk is concerned, this County has never had a more popular representative at Queen's Park nor one more eminently fitted to represent this grand old County. Even though he is not a native of Norfolk and still resides in Haldimand-Norfolk people have generally adopted him as one of their own. This applies to Townsend and Windham as well, even though these two Townships are not a part of his constituency.

Since Jim Allan won his first victory at the polls in Haldimand-Norfolk back in 1951, he has made many hundreds of new friends in Norfolk County. His winning personality and his readiness to go to any lengths to serve his constituents have earned for him the warmest regard of countless friends. We doubt if any other Provincial member has ever attended more public functions in Norfolk County. Seldom has he ever declined an invitation and only then because of pressing government duties elsewhere. On many occasions he has driven through the foulest weather to grace a Norfolk banquet table or to officiate at a public function hereabouts.

His contributions to Norfolk County in the past twelve years are too numerous to detail here, but several are outstanding. One is the new Ontario Boy's Training School in Woodhouse Township. At the time of its official opening, Hon. Mr. Allan disclaimed any credit for this fine institution, but we believe that he was unduly modest. Another is the new Ontario Experimental Farm for fruits and vegetables north-east of Simcoe, which is a very important acquisition for Norfolk agriculture and will prove increasingly so in the years ahead. Finally, as Provincial Treasurer and Norfolk's member, Jim Allan was in no small measure responsible for securing the financial guarantee from the Province for taking some 23 million pounds of "no sale" tobacco off the market this year, involving upwards of \$11,000,000 of Provincial finances, and thus saving the blue-cured industry from a disastrous situation.

These are a few of the contributions of Hon. James N. Allan, for Norfolk and Ontario, which he will long be remembered in. At Queen's Park his record of distinguished service is well known. From 1955 to 1958 he was Minister of stern wheeler, a three masted schooner and lantern canoes all along the river course to give the visitors a scenic journey along the rivers of America and a glimpse of Mark Twain Country.
