Soybeans are not a popular crop in Haldimand County but some are being grown. The secretary - manager of the Ont. Soya-Bean Growers' Marketing Board, Mr. Ken Standing, had some interesting comments at Safety is only a word until

the recent Annual Meeting of this Board.

He indicated that imports to Canada of soybeans, meal and oil exceed fifty million dollars annually, with the volume of soybean alone amounting to over 13 million bushels.

If favourable conditions for growing this crop exist in this section of Ontario, perhaps part of this obvious hole in our farm products could be partly filled with area-grown soybeans.

On checking the production, price and gross returns per acre of soybeans, they appear to be quite comparable with fall wheat as a cash crop. 


