### THE WEEK AT OTTAWA

OTTAWA (CP) - The nuclear arms debate continued to dominate the capital last week as overhauling such developments as the elimination of surplus funds and the reduction of government expenditures. Prime Minister Diefenbaker appears to have pointed the way for the Conservative party towards a non-nuclear policy for Canada.

When Canada agreed to build a base at North Bay, Ont., and Macaza, Que., the principal reason was that America was being bombed from Russia.

Mr. Fleming's pending departure is a heavy jolt for the Diefenbaker cabinet, already hard hit by the resignations of Defence Minister Harkness, Trade Minister Healey and Associate Minister Bennett.

There have been reports that Mr. Fleming might be appointed to a vacancy in the Supreme Court.
