Contract Awarded For Construction of New West Haldimand Hospital

The building is also designed to provide for expansion at a later date at a minimum of cost. The mechanical and electrical features are also designed for such an expansion. The general contract for the project will include Architectural, furnishing and equipment, land, road and landscaping and sewer and water extensions. The project is a four-year struggle by the West Haldimand Hospital Board to work out the varied and complicated details involved in such a project. The Board is confident that the planning and decisions will all be reflected with satisfaction when the project is completed. The costs involved in the project are substantially more than had been anticipated in the earlier stages of planning. However, the Board feels that every dollar of investment will be reflected in the quality of the project. The Board is proud of the values of the design and the equipment in the range of an amount that can be financed by the Hospital Board.
