LABOR PUSHERS PLAN - The Ontario Federation of Labor plans to mail 250,000 postcards this month as part of its campaign for a provincial government action on medical care program.

The Federation hopes its campaign will make government-sponsored medical care the big issue in the next provincial election.

The campaign will include medical action committees, radio broadcasts, telecasts, windmill stickers, taped speeches, service club addresses and a medicine week next month.

"We intend to take the fight to every street corner in Ontario," said the president David Archer in Toronto last weekend.

TORONTO FACE-LIFT - Toronto's city planning department has prepared a 20-year plan to give the city's core a complete face-lift.

Among other things, the plan envisages pedestrian bridges and auto tunnels which would, in effect, separate pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

In some places pedestrian malls would be built over a system of underground tunnels for buses and cars.

Problems common to Toronto's downtown area are listed as: Growing traffic and pedestrian congestion; a serious lack of property or parking facilities; the chaotic and cramping character of street layouts and services; a lack of visual neighborhood cohesion and the absence of proper pedestrian access to the waterfront.
