He said that modern business methods had been used to make the sales, namely on credit terms and he emphasized the fact that not one percent had been lost on the deal so far. He also pointed out a truth that should be understood and that is that production in Canada exceeds the consumption needs of Canadians and under these circumstances there are only two solutions to the problems that arise from this situation. Either restrict production or get out and sell the surplus on an export basis. In a round about way he said this is the responsibility of every Canadian businessman.
