Financial need should not be the determining factor in separate school grants under the Ontario government's new equalization policy for elementary schools, says Alan C. MacRobbie, a county master of the Ontario Grange Lodge.

Mr. MacRobbie, a lawyer, told about 200 persons attending a reception in Toronto Friday for George Warren of St. John's, Nfld., Grand Master of Canada, that only 15 percent of the province's elementary students attend Roman Catholic secondary schools.

"We want to see that grants the government intends to give to supplement taxes are in the same proportion .85 per cent to the public schools .15 per cent to the separate schools."

"The separate school battle has been waged long and long for a century and a quarter and the Roman Catholic bishop."

ops are not satisfied, as is evidenced by their brief," he said. "A system of separate schools is not ecumenical or unifying but segregating. It is not even coexistence."

MAY ALLOW SUBSIDY
Municipal Affairs Minister J. W. Spence said Friday the province is considering allowing Metropolitan Toronto to subsidize the Toronto Transit Commission to prevent a threatened fare increase April 1.

He advised the TTC to "sit tight" and see what the provincial government would do. TTC chairman Ralph Day has said fares will rise to six for a dollar instead of seven unless the commission gets a \$3,500,000 operating subsidy from the metropolitan council.

The decision on fares hinges on whether the legislature amends the act governing the metropolitan council to permit it to pay the subsidy.

MOVE DEFEATED
A move to protect directors and employees of the Ontario Credit Union League Limited from also holding positions in a provincial society of co-operatives, was defeated at the league's annual meeting in Toronto Saturday.

League officials said the motion, sponsored by credit unions at Hamilton and the Lakehead, was almost mostly at preventing league officials and employees from becoming associated with the Ontario Co-operatives and credit unions. It accepts deposits from members and makes loans to them.

The league offers similar services to about 1,400 credit unions. The three-day annual meeting ended Saturday.

APPROVE SEWERS
Construction of a \$248,700 sewerage disposal system in the Perth County village of Milverton has been approved by the Ontario Municipal Board although the villagers voted against it last fall.

The OMB's decision noted that raw sewage from the Village has polluted the municipal drain in Mornington Township, resulting in complaints from farmers in the area.

Sanitary officials told the board such pollution should be eradicated.

HARDER TO GET

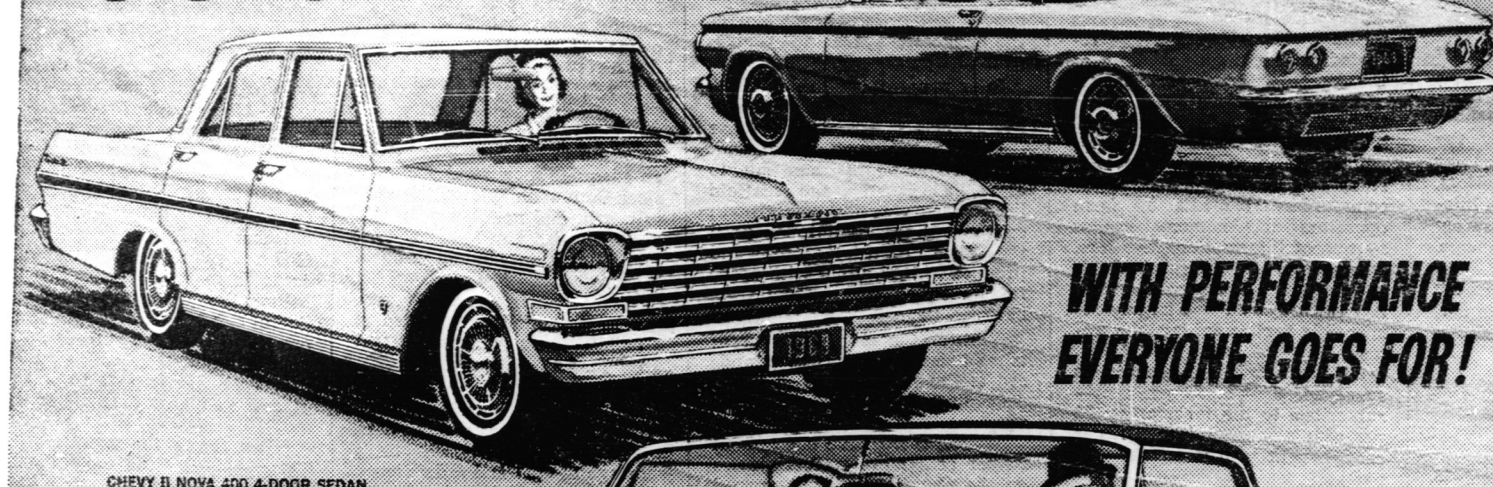
