NEW FARM LEGISLATION

TO PROTECT FARMERS

s follows earlier stiffening penalties under the Ontario me and Fisheries Act which ould provide greater protection for farmers against irreponsible hunters.

This new act makes it possible for persons who have livestock killed or injured or proposition for farmers were also concerned. Farmers should not be asked to be responsible for damages and this act, the not be asked to be responsible for damages and this act, the Minister felt, would relieve them. "This legislation", he said, "will make it possible for the Crown to recover costs, and this along with stiffer penalties, should act as a deterrent to those who think they can ignore the property rights of farm people".

Compensation payments are limited to the market value of the livestock or property. The act stipulates that the government can appoint valuers to appraise the injury or damage.


