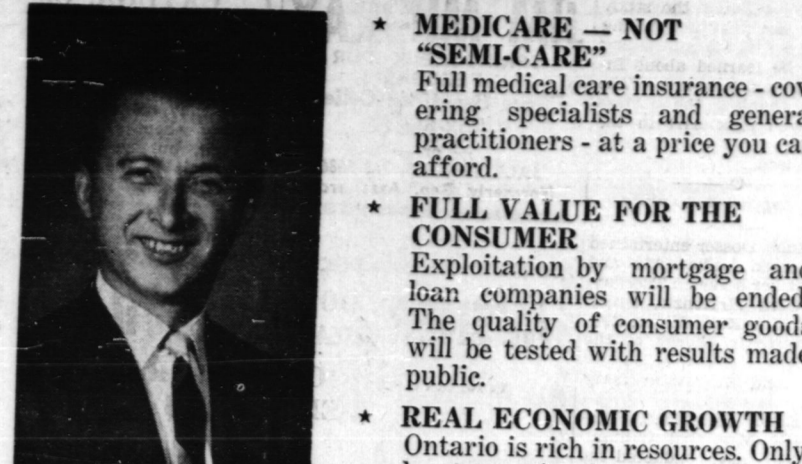

On the Farm - Front

Have fewer sucklers will well show any road map which will show them where to go to avoid the presence of Ragweed Pollen. The Canadian Travel Bureau publishes an edition called "Can. adia Havens from Hay Fever". The publication lists the places in Ontario which have an average ragweed pollen air index below 10 which indicates that any of them would furnish measure of relief to hay fever sufferers.

New bulletins and leaflets of interest include the following: **POISON IVY** - The description and control of this versatile plant, as well as the treatment of infected persons is covered in this leaflet. This plant may appear as a dwarfed, shrubby plant a few inches high carrying the ground, or it may be a round tree, shrub, and post-turbulence weed can easily be eradicated and its description and control are covered in detail. As well, low pollen areas in Ontario are listed.

REMOVAL OF BEES FROM BUILDINGS AND TREES - Methods of destroying bees and their nests are described and illustrated in this leaflet. It is available for anyone who wishes to transfer honey bees to another location.

AQUATIC PLANTS AND ALGAE CONTROL - Types of aquatic plants, along with control measures, when to treat, dosage rates make this an interesting bulletin for persons with water plants.

In addition, various water plants are well illustrated and available from the Agricultural Office, Cayuga.

Work safely - Your family needs you.

Each month the Agricultural Office is notified of a high percentage in the county who have nominated bulls in their herds.
