ONTARIO BOOM SAID LONGEST SINCE SECOND WORLD WAR

Ontario is currently in its longest boom period since the Second World War, Provincial Treasurer James N. Allan said in London, Ont., Saturday.

Mr. Allan, a 3rd degree Mason and deputy grand master of the Grand Lodge of Canada, was speaking at a dinner meeting of the Chamber of Commerce, Perfection, Scottish Rite.

The provincial treasurer said the present expansion period is not in its fourth year. He pointed to climbing employment, the 4-4-4 jobless rate to 3.8 per cent, record-breaking steel output, pig iron and automobile production as signs of an expanding economy.

He had to work hard to keep the 4-4-4 program up-to-date. The basic aim of 4-4-4 is to help prepare the members to become good citizens of their community and change the province with the years, however, and it is a pleasure to note the fine contribution which the members of the 4-4-4 clubs in Haldimand County are presently making toward agricultural and community welfare.
