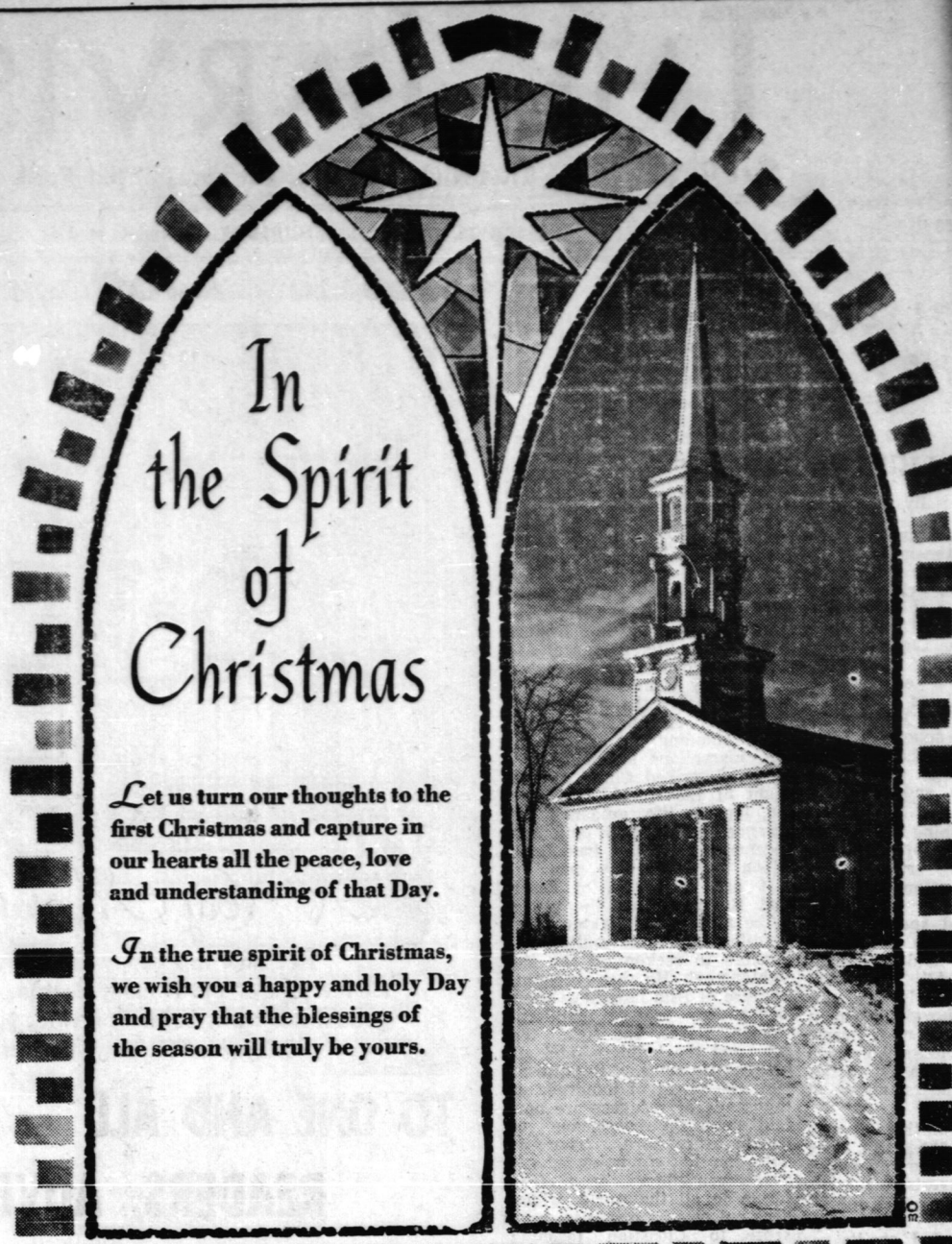

An amateur hockey player has little chance of combating with a professional in that field.

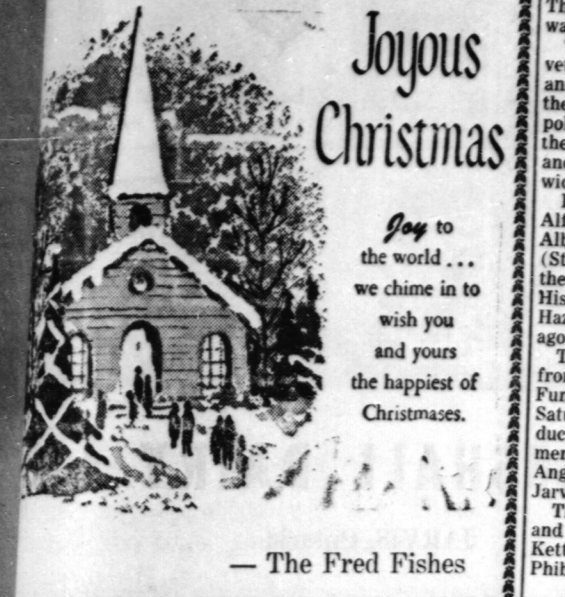

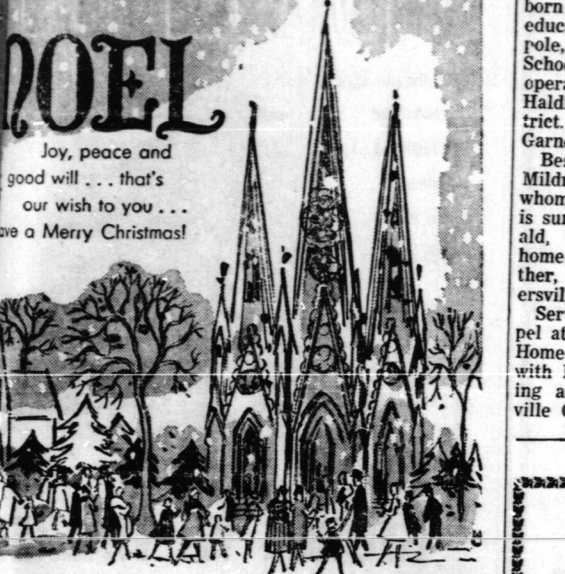

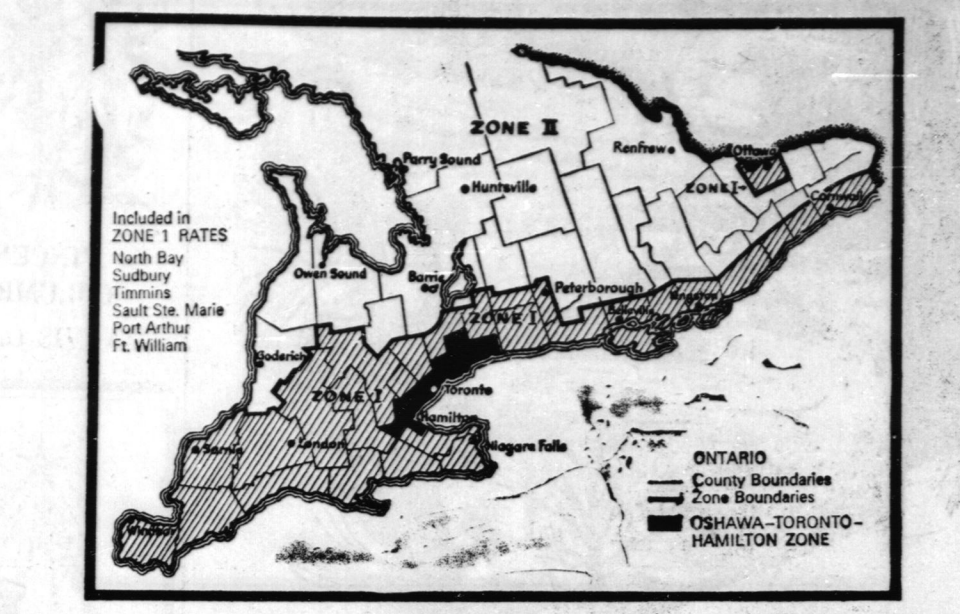

Minimum Wage levels will rise on Dec. 28, 1964

A Reminder - A Minimum wage of \$1.00 an hour is being introduced by stages for both men and women workers throughout Ontario. The next stage in this progression occurs on December 28, 1964, when the following Minimum Wage rates will be effective. ZONE 1 - Southern Ontario and Major Northern Ontario Cities: Men - \$1.00 per hour, Women - .95 per hour. Construction continues at \$1.25 per hour. ZONE 2 - Northern Ontario, except Major Cities: Men - .90 per hour, Women - .80 per hour. Construction continues at \$1.15 per hour.

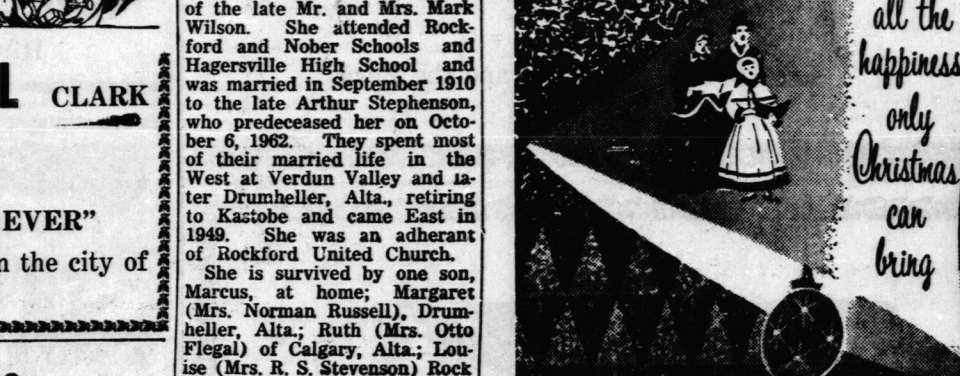

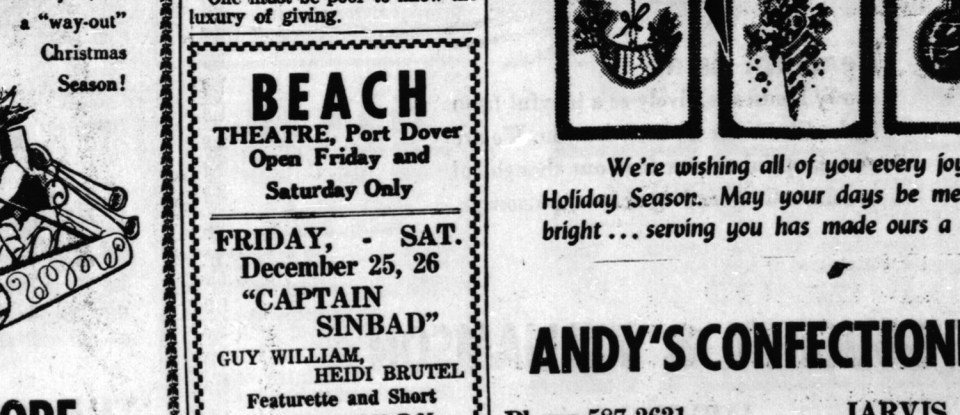
