The Federation points out that since 1977 total realized net farm income (returns from all sources) has increased in Canada as a whole has always been lower than in 1949. In 1980 it was \$% less, but when income figures are adjusted to 1949 basis, the actual decline in the 14 years was approximately 35%. However, the number of farm operators since 1949, the average realized net income per operator has declined \$8,000 up about 54%. Adjusted to constant dollars, the increase was only 7.8%. The
