**BASIC COMMONWEALTH VALUES MUST BE GUARDED — MASSEY**

OTTAWA (CP) — Though all nations must work out their own salvation, there are certain values civil rights as much as racial equality that we must preserve at all costs.

Mr. Massey said that up to a point it may be claimed that variations on the democratic theme to suit local conditions are permissible. It could even be argued that as regards race, the Commonwealth is a melting pot of diverse peoples and races.

Mr. Massey proposed that the Commonwealth of Nations should be a union of individual liberty and human respect. The great heritage of ideas and knowledge which the Commonwealth has inherited, he said, should be used to broaden the framework of co-operation and enrich each member.

"Aid for education is not really aid at all—it is a form of partnership, education opens the door of understanding, and besides showing the way and leading the way, it is a commitment to them, I think, exemplified by the recent declaration of racial equality."

"Here we see the unique and constructive leadership which the Commonwealth can exercise in securing the application of democratic principles."

"We cannot all have the same constitutional mechanism. But equally, we must not expect too much of the Commonwealth's role, respect for the tradition of limited liability."

"In the field of (government) welfare and security programs particularly, a good many things are sold to the public without a full statement of what is being bought, what it costs, and who will pay."
