The Panel made a study of the Jarvis property, and of facilities already in existence. Possible development was discussed at length by the Panel - among the members, and with the delegations from many other Jarvis communities. The recommendations of this Panel took the form of advice, and followed: To the delegation from Jarvis. You are to be commended for securing additional land for future park use and development. The population of your area makes park planning of the utmost importance, to avoid existing facilities that will not be fully used. Parks are for two purposes: exercise and education. They are important. The first requisite of a park area is TOILET FACILITIES and DRINKING WATER readily available during daylight hours at least. No one can draw up a standard plan, for your particular use, that will be a success. You can determine your own needs better than any outsider, and must do most of your own planning and development. Do NOT make the mistake of rushing into a development project that you have no regrets later on. We can mention dozens of developments that have proved to be a waste of thousands of dollars and untold hours of hard effort: handball diamonds, football grids, tennis courts (fencing and lighting) bowling greens with lighting, etc. that did NOT get enough use to justify their existence - and were later torn up. BEWARE of building facilities that will not get FULL USE. An open space - reasonably level - with grass trimmed to a reasonable height, may well prove to be more valuable than many developed areas. We call your attention to Gage Park in Hamilton. This park is noted for its flowers and flower beds, but to many more people it is noted for the open field area at the south end. Here children of all ages, and adults as well, individually and in groups of all sizes, bounce and toss balls, reach, pass and kick footballs, play tag and other games, fly kites, fly model airplanes, etc. etc.

The Hamilton Recreation Committee gets more favourable comment on this undeveloped area in the city. In summary, our advice to you: Do NOT develop and then try to promote the use of the facilities you have provided. LET the public ask for facilities - and then provide them. If enough people want something, they will ask for it. Make sure that enough people are really interested. Make sure that it will be used year after year. Then GO! GO! GO! with development.

Continued from page 1... fruits, vegetables, fats and oils and miscellaneous items like sugar, corn syrup, spaghetti, etc. In 1947, this basket cost an average of \$82.00 retail. In 1964, a basket of the same quantity of the same items cost an average of \$1,015.00. In 1964, the farmer received 30¢ or 38.80 per bushel (1967) leaving a farm-gate price spread at \$642.00. This is an important point. Here is the depression year! The 37% share for the farmer is the lowest he has received in the last 20 years. In 1931 to 1934 when his share got down as low as 25% - 30% of what it was then. Even at that, it impeded some \$800, 000,000 worth of U.S. farm products into Canada last year.
