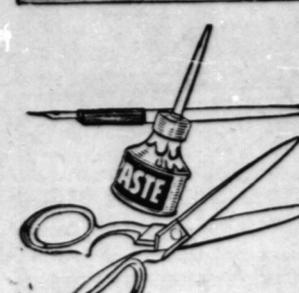

An Indian doctor said last week the Ontario College of Physicians and Surgeons seems to use race as a basis for recognizing medical qualifications. Dr. Krishna Baichwal, one of several Asian doctors whose petition to practice in Ontario was recently turned down, was speaking at a seminar on immigrants and education, sponsored by an Italian group in Toronto.

An Italian lawyer, qualified in his own country, complained he had to start again at second year university level (two years junior to first year law school) in order to practice in Ontario.

Dr. Baichwal complained that his qualifications were accepted in the other nine provinces and in Britain. He is now on the teaching staff of a Toronto hospital but is not licensed to take private patients because the university in India does not recognize Dr. Baichwal also has postgraduate qualifications from Britain but these are not considered relevant by the Ontario College of Physicians.

He said all he and his colleagues asked was to take examinations to test their qualifications but "I am still denied permission to do so."

Some participants in the seminar suggested the Ontario Human Rights Commission should investigate the organizations which license teachers and professional men in the province to see if they are discriminating against already-toronto residents.
