The federal and provincial governments are to put up millions of dollars for a war on poverty in Ontario. The main beneficiaries are expected to be Indians and a few "hillbilly" white communities.

Officials were not willing to comment on the arrangement before its documents were signed, but reporters expected the first stages to concentrate on training.

One of the first parts of the new program will be a \$2,000,000 school and community centre at Moosonee, 190 miles north of Timmins on James Bay.

This centre will take care of all the district's educational problems, from kindergarten to vocational training and adult literacy.

LIBERAL LEADER FINED Andrew Thompson, Liberal M.L.A. and party leader, was fined \$250 at Peterborough for dangerous driving which resulted in a two-car accident, injuring four people October 6.

SEEK SPECIAL LAW Toronto's board of control asked the Ontario legislature to pass special legislation to reduce the man's tax bill after hearing what Mayor Philip Givens called the most fantastic story he has ever heard.

Musa Shaba, now unemployed but formerly manager of a dance hall which was burned out in 1962, says he is bankrupt and faced with a bill of \$3,917.60 for back taxes, and has lost his hair into the bargain.

When his dance-hall was burned, his insurance company paid \$82,000, after three years of litigation involving seven firms of lawyers. Legal fees totalled \$17,000 and the rest of the money went to Mr. Shaba's mortgagees.

He estimated his personal loss at \$60,000. The back taxes bill is due and the premises up for sale because the high assessment of the burned-out dance-hall was never changed, though it is derelict, and none of Mr. Shaba's lawyers advised him to pay the taxes, he said.

LONGER RETURNS Wayne Longergan, a convicted killer with a mental illness bracket, was paroled in New York last week and deported.

Now 47, Longergan was convicted in 1943 of the manslaughter of a woman and sentenced to 30 years in life imprisonment.

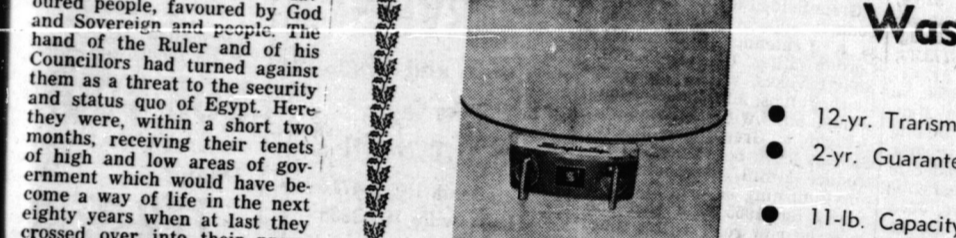
